A Seniors Walk in Cradle Mountain Park.

Early this year I was fortunate to be asked if I would like to join a group of professional photographers on a 10 day guided excursion in the Cradle Mountain - Lake St.Clair National Park. A five minute discussion with Elaine and I was back on the phone to confirm that I would go.

I thought I would share with our members, the feasibility and enjoyment of doing this at our stage in life.

There were five of us aged from early 40's to mid 60's three blokes (one had a knee replacement 18 months ago) and two ladies. All capably assisted by four guides aged between 17 and 27. Great fun people led capably by a young lady of 22.

Fine weather in this area for the 10 days was a lucky break for us as we used tents in camping spots rather than the huts. Our guides and some of the group actually slept under the stars. Some also swam in the lakes. They said it was cold and I took their word for it.

We covered over 70 Km. I carried a pack of about 15 Kg. plus my photo gear (5Kg). Guides carried food and tents and some of our personals. I found the walk to be tough in places but never felt it to threaten my health or cause physical injury. Properly fitted back packs should not really have any effect on common back problems. Good footwear provides great stability in rough places where there is a risk of stumbling and falling. Prompt attention to any developing blisters helps prevent discomfort. Joint pain will probably occur but provided it subsides when you rest, it should not be a concern. Plenty of Glucosamine in the weeks before the trip is recommended.

The tough parts of the walk, clambering over rocks or walking up steep paths, are soon forgotten when the magnificent countryside and beautiful views appear at the top. I felt that the most important factor in enjoying the walks and minimising trauma to your body and risk of injury, is to avoid watching time and hurrying and rest as often as you want to. Walking a track means that for a lot of the time you are looking at your feet to see where to step next, so, it is important to stop frequently and look around you. Taking in the atmosphere is the priority, not getting there in record time. I like to think that it's not the challenge of the walk, but the enjoyment of the surroundings that are not accessible any other way.

There were up to 70 people at the hut sites on the track each evening. It is "first in first served" for tables and bunk space in the huts. Our guides placed our camp in some very quiet and beautiful areas nearby the huts and facilities (water and toilets) but far enough away to be quiet and secluded. With the weather we had, this was definitely the better option. By camping by streams, we had access to pristine water and could go down stream to our own "bathroom" to wash each evening. (no soap allowed and cold but invigorating). If we were too far away from the huts and their excellent clean and comfortable "composting" toilets, we went 50m downstream and 50m away from the stream with "Trevor" the trowel.

I believe any reasonably healthy senior can get fit enough and comfortably complete a guided walk like this provided proper preparation is made. A health check by your doctor , fitness walking for several weeks before the trip (5Km a day min) and good quality footwear clothing and back pack are the main things to attend to. There is a special walking stick available that even the fit young guides swear by (some use two) as a wonderful aid to help spread the load and provide stability. At a cost though, \$100.00 each. I will have one or perhaps two of these for my next venture. If any members are intested in an evening where I can provide more detail of my experience and show some pictures please let me know.
