## Last Month's Events

### The Melbourne City Walk Tuesday 31 May Doug Hayne

23 Members and friends drove to The Zoo but escaped being interned there even though we may be considered to be a rare species.

From the Zoo we started our walk by going across Royal Park towards our first objective - coffee in Lygon St. On the way we passed and observed the Ormond and Queens Colleges of the Melbourne University.

Coffee at one of the many Lygon coffee places in a room of our own so that our noise wouldn't disturb any groups of youngsters that may drop in for a quiet coffee. After our refreshment we moved on down Lygon St. to the Carlton Gardens which were in the last of their autumn splendour as were the other parks passed through during the day.

We then did a quick tour of St Patrick's Cathedral noting that some of us had passed by many times over 50 years or so but never dropped in to say a word to the landlord there. A splendid building showing the skills and dedication of the workers, craftsmen and architects of the 19th Century.

Leon pointed out that when the new stands are completed for the 2006 games, the oldest part of the infrastructure will be the light towers installed in the mid 1980's. From the MCG we walked over the Jolimont rail yards to Melbourne Park past the Vodaphone and Rod Laver arena's across to the Olympic Park and Lexus centre where Leon mentioned (as a Melbourne supporter), "that's where 'they' have their headquarters. We looked but found no sign of Eddie there. We crossed over the Yarra River on the Swan Street bridge with me having to provide a demonstration of how to use a pedestrian zebra crossing. "Waiting for the green light takes too long when there isn't one there" I had to mention as we moved on into The Domain to the Sydney Myer Music Bowl. Here we sat in the auditorium as an audience to no one and bought out our packed lunch and reminisced about The Seekers concerts and the many Christmas Carols Events some of us had experienced here. After an impromptu dance and group photo on the stage of the bowl, we moved on towards our next goal, The Shrine of Remembrance. Margaret noted that according to her pacemaker she had covered 14000 steps which was about 8K - half way.

At the steps up to the Shrine we took another group photo and then proceeded into the Shrine where we observed the simulated passing of the sun over the word "Love" in the script "Greater Love Hath No Man" It was explained to us that this is set up for the sunlight to pass this way at 11am on November 11th- Armistice day for WW1. A moving tribute was then presented for us, ending with the emotive bugle call of the "Last Post".

We then moved on through Kings Domain, over St Kilda Road and Kings way we passed the MacRobertsons Girls High here but none of our ladies could affirm that they attended here. I did say that I used to hang around the college in my youth but it was decided that this didn't count as attending. On to Albert Park and around the west side of the lake where Leon flirted with a swan which with Leon being a Demons' supporter was a bit strange. However, a photo was taken to record his interest and we all moved on to leave the swan to do what swans do. Passing the light rail reserve, brought back memories of the old St Kilda red rattler with its "dog box" carriages. We moved on under the ancient pedestrian underpass to Fitzroy Street and the prospect of afternoon tea where memories of the area were shared. Well most of the memories anyway. Ron and I were delighted to at last recall the name of the "Tolarno" We had to see the sign to finally recall it though.

Leo's Spaghetti Bar looks the same as it did 50 years ago as did the old pub the which all came to realise was what I was referring to when I mentioned that I had many times sung in front of the "Prince of Wales" here in St Kilda.

A final walk down Fitzroy St to The Esplanade to catch our Number 15 Tram with the warmth and comfort of the tram making us relax as we made our way back to the Zoo. We had walked over 16Km in 6 hours or so.

**Profile – Noel and Brenda Hatton**

Noel was born in 1935 in Sunshine, his father owned the local dairy. Noel attended Sunshine state school, and Williamstown High. In the late 40's the family sold up the dairy and went into the hotel business at the

Newmarket hotel in Kyneton. Noel attended Kyneton High for 2 years. In 1951 they went into the Polo Club hotel in Ascot Vale, where Noel lived until his marriage to Brenda. Noel attended Essendon High for the last two years of his schooling.

He became an apprentice carpenter, after finishing school. He attended Essendon Tech, for his training, and attended night classes in Building Supervision, and drawing.

In 1956 he served in the National service at Puckapunyal, and then spent 4 years in the CMF (Citizen's Military Forces).

He finished his apprenticeship in 1957 working for Prentice builders for 37 years. He became a Foreman in the 60's and advanced to site manager. He helped to build several medical research laboratories, as well as fitting out hospital wards. One of his favourite jobs, was refurbishing several wards at the Children's hospital for cancer patients, and took joy in seeing the children's faces, after their old wards were brightened with new paint and murals. Another job Noel enjoyed was when he built soundproof rooms, for Professor Clarke, who was working on his cochlear implants. He also helped to install one of the first MRI units at the Epworth hospital. In 1993 he began sub contracting for some friends who had started up business, helping them with his experience.

**Brenda**

I was born in Shepparton in 1937, for my first 5 years, the family lived in Oaklands in the Riverina as my dad was the local butcher. In 1943 we returned to Shepparton, where my two sisters were born, and in 1952, the family moved to Broadmeadows, for 12 months helping a family member run the Broadmeadows hotel. Then we moved to Essendon, where my parents still live.

I attended St. Columba's College, Essendon till I was 16, then spent some time at Stott's business college. My first position was a comptometrist, working in the pay office of Australian controls, as well as doing accounting. In 1956 I worked for Ansett, as a pay officer. This was an exciting time to be working at the airport, as the Olympics were held in Melbourne, and the staff always managed to be first in line, to see the athletes and other celebrities, when they arrived.

For the next 3 years I worked for my dad helping him run several businesses, in a shopping strip and doing all his book work. After our marriage, I returned to Australian controls working in the engineering office's time and motion study department.

We married in 1960, and started to build our first home in East Keilor in 1962, 3 years later, we were notified that the land was needed for part of the Calder freeway, so we had to start all over again in the West Essendon area.

In 1966 our son Paul was born and in 1969, our daughter Sharyn followed. I returned to full time work in 1980, as a school secretary, for 15 years. Holidays were mostly spent at the beach in Ocean Grove, or at Mansfield for the snow in winter.

In the 1980's we got the wander bug, and travelled either by caravan or coach, around most of Australia. We also toured both islands of New Zealand, and sailed around the Yasawa islands of Fiji.

After I retired in 1995, Noel took long service, and we spent 3 months travelling by coaches through Great Britain and Ireland, and most of Europe, including the then recently opened Eastern countries. We have many photos and videos to remind us of these trips.

We moved to Templestowe in 2000 when Noel retired. After renovating the house to our liking, we joined the U3A where we have attended many classes and walking groups. We became foundation members of the Probus Club of Templestowe Valley, meeting a wonderful group of new friends. Noel has also joined the Greythorn Bowls club, and enjoys playing club games while he is still learning the art of bowling. We now have 5 grandchildren and 4 step grandchildren, 7 of them live in USA, but hopefully will be back in Australia in the next few years. We have visited the family in Oklahoma, and spent time in Los Angeles, touring all the famous Movie lots and Disney land.
