Candlebark Walk - Noel Hatton

On Wednesday, Feb 9, our walk was held in ideal conditions. Starting from the car park adjacent to Fitzsimmons Lane bridge, we walked through to Beasleys Nursery, with a car pool which was well organized for those who decided against the return walk (the majority). We followed the track through Candlebark Park, and along to the new pedestrian bridge over the Yarra, to contemplate the now more subdued water levels following the recent very heavy rains. Further along we passed Petty's Orchard with trees laden with fruit, we also observed rosellas, and yellow tailed black cockatoos perched in riverside gums. As we continued a little further, quite a number of kangaroos could be seen feeding and moving through the grass areas. We carried on to the viewing area of the junction of the Mullum Mullum Creek with the Yarra, and the sight of the abandoned homestead of pioneer Major Newman, Tontville' on the opposite bank. The track then veers away from the river and roughly follows the creek. We then passed below some beautiful homes and gardens on our right, through Tikalara Park and skirted the Council and electricity depots to arrive at Beazley's tea rooms for a very pleasant coffee break.

Churchill Island Hugh Cornell

On Wednesday, February 23, 2005, a group of 36 members and friends travelled to Churchill Island, courtesy of U.S. Coaches. Our genial driver, Bill Pine, was very informed about the areas through which we passed, such as the market gardens in the Cranbourne area and the extensive housing estates of Narre Warren and Berwick. He also informed us of the fast-growing tourist industry of Western Port Bay and nearby areas of South Gippsland, giving several examples. Arriving at San Remo, we were treated to a splendid morning tea, followed by an entertaining time watching about 40 pelicans being fed on the beach by a gentleman from the local fish co-operative. As a bonus, the sighting of three stingrays in the shallows provided an interesting contrast. The coach took us across the San Remo bridge to Phillip Island and across another small bridge to Churchill Island, where we were taken to the Visitor's Centre and supplied with a nutritious basket lunch, which was enjoyed in the lovely surrounding property with its panoramas of Western Port Bay. After lunch, we inspected the Amess Homestead (1872), the seaside retreat of Samuel Amess, a former mayor of Melbourne, together with its delightful flower and herb garden. This was followed by a stroll around the various outbuildings to see working horses and farm equipment. Before leaving, we did some shopping in the Visitor's Centre and informed ourselves of the history of Churchill Island, learning that March 2001 marked the 200th Anniversary of the landing of Lt. James Grant. The historic precinct was sold to the Victorian Government in 1976 and opened to the public in 1981 by the Honourable Rupert Hamer. It is currently managed by the Phillip Island Nature Park group. We then travelled to Cowes where we spent about an hour looking around the main street and enjoying coffees and ice-creams before re-boarding the coach

for our return trip, accompanied by relaxing music to end a perfect day. Many thanks to Elaine for arranging such an interesting and enjoyable trip.

Profile – Yvonne Boyall

I was born in Williamstown, attended the State School then on to Williamstown Girls School. At the age of sixteen I became an apprentice hairdresser for 4 years. During that time I met David Boyall who was doing his Pharmacy qualifications. We both qualified in our professions within a month of each other. I purchased a salon in Charles Street, Newport. The business was a success and David and I married.

My transport was a pushbike whilst David had a little Austin A40 coupe which he used for his relieving pharmacist duties. As time went by David decided he wanted to acquire his own pharmacy so off we went to see the General Manager of Drug House of Australia (D.H.A). His words were "yes, we will back you kids".

We bought a business at the corner of Boronia and Dorset Roads, and moved to Boronia. David, a very astute businessman, had me delivering medicine all around the Dandenongs. The business grew and David decided to go farming.... it was a tax dodge in those days but not for long!

We acquired a property, Pleasant Banks at Yarck on the Melba Highway. We started with Santa Gertrudis stud but the breed was not suited to Victoria's climate. We sold the Santa's and bought Poll Herefords. The stud farm grew and so did our success with Grand Champion Bull and Grand Champion female at the Sydney Royal show along with wins at Melbourne Show and Canberra.

It was amazing how one can adapt oneself to various ways of life. I learnt very quickly about farming life. We also ran sheep so of course there was cooking for shearers and when the ewes lambed quite often they prolapsed with many an operation being performed stitching them back up with tie wire.

For eight years over this period I also did the marketing and promotion of the Victorian Poll Herefords Cattle Society. Over all this time the pharmacy in Boronia was still going strong being managed by Don Schultz who now owns the pharmacy today.

David died of prostate cancer at the age of 64. I have three daughters, and eight grandchildren, three girls and five boys. My eldest daughter, Debi, had the worlds first IVF twins born 16 months apart. They are now aged 19 and 20. The younger of the two, Chelsea, holds the Victorian, NSW, and South Australian Speed and Marathon Water Skiing titles and has also represented Australia at the World Titles where she came in third place. All the grandchildren water-ski and enjoy various sports of which I am a regular spectator.

Over the years I have also had the pleasure of serving the community in Boronia where David was given the Honor of the Charter President of the Boronia Rotary Club in 1968. Many good years, many good friends. I now enjoy immensely the companionship and great times with the ladies and gents of our Probus Club.
