



## President's Message –Peter Fishley

In my message last month, I mentioned the use of the suggestion box to convey ideas about activities that the Club may consider embracing. Most of us probably see this function as the most appropriate use of the box. However, its use goes beyond that. For instance, if you wish to raise any issue at all, such as to make a point about the Club's administration, or to seek clarification about a decision of the Committee, put it in writing and put it in the box. The Committee will consider your suggestion that afternoon, now that it meets at 3.00pm the day of the club meeting. A personal reply will be sent to you if necessary but most times feedback will be via the monthly meeting or through the *Newsletter*.

At the June club meeting, three such suggestions / comments were received and duly considered by the Committee: a report on each follows.

The first was that the agenda of the Club Meeting include a time for questions. If you think back to the June club meeting, you will recall that Fellowship Break had to be curtailed by 15 minutes because of an overrun of the business part of the meeting. Steps are being taken to shave the time spent on certain aspects of the meeting \* but as these measures are unlikely to do more than reclaim lost time, the agenda will not permit the luxury of opening the meeting to questions without notice

The second was a query about the change of venue of the monthly lunch. The reason the Committee abandoned the Manningham Club and the incentive it offered of rewarding us with a \$100 voucher if we dined there 11 times out of 12 within the year, was that a sizable portion of the members requested a change because they were dissatisfied with the level of the service it offered.

The third query concerned the co-option of Ron McBain to the Committee, initially to assist the Activities Officer. As members will know, the number of activities has increased. As well, we recently experienced some double booking of activities and co-ordination of the time-table was required and this needs to be maintained. Finally, the Activities Officer indicated that he would be unable to perform his duties throughout July. Ron will give Activities his best shot and take on other tasks as the need arises following the pattern of service Ian Gault gave the Committee last year when he, too, was co-opted onto it.

I hope this explains the actions taken by the Committee in these matters and answers those who raised the queries. Good clubbing.

\*1) Activities leaders will no longer be called upon to address the club meeting. If they do have something to add to their reports over and above what they have stated in the *Newsletter*, they are asked to write it out and give it to Activities Officer John Mugridge (or his deputy, Ron McBain), upon arriving at the hall. The Activities Officer will then present a consolidated report to the meeting when called upon to do so.

\*2) As requested previously, any member wishing to address the club meeting must make prior arrangement with the President well before the date of the club meeting.

## What's The Catch – (There is One)

Dietitians tell us that:

**“There are around 140 calories in a 375 ml stubby of the average full strength beer.”**

Scientists tell us that:

**“One Calorie = the amount of energy required to raise one gram of water by one degree Celsius” (one gram of water = 1 ml)**

Given that beer is over 90% water, the amount of energy required to raise the temperature of 375 mls of beer from the perfect cold beer temperature of 4°C to my body temperature 37°C (33 Celsius degrees) is:therefore

1 ml x 33 = 33 calories per ml x 375ml = 12,375 calories.

So, if I drink a cold stubby of beer, my body will use 12,375 calories to heat that beer up to my body temperature. The beer itself will negate 140 calories of that so the net energy going from my body is 12,235 calories. This is more than enough to counteract the 3000 – 5000 calories of food and drinks I have consumed that day. **Drink cold beer and use the calories to lose weight.**

## Walking for a beer (What's the catch here?)

Each 10 minute Km you walk burns approximately 50 calories. Each stubby you drink adds about 140 calories to your diet.

An average sized fit senior male will normally maintain a steady weight of about 70 Kilos. If he walks 3 Km each day in 30 minutes he will have done about 100 Kms of walking per month. At 50 calories per Km, that means that each month, he will burn about 5000 calories more through his walking.

According to dietitians, burning 5000 calories you will lose 1.5 Kilos. That's how much weight he will lose each month by walking. In order to stay even, he needs to intake an equivalent number of calories. If he does this by adding beer to his diet he will need 5,000 divided by 140 (calories per stubby) = 36 stubbies per month, or 1.2 per day. The average male would do this willingly to maintain the balance of nature and his own well being.

Simple calculation tells you that you shouldn't stop drinking beer even if you want to (who wants to anyway.) Here's why.

Suppose you stopped drinking beer today and changed nothing else about your lifestyle. You still walk 3 Kms a day, and lose weight in the process. In one year, you would lose 20 kilos. Your weight, if you are an average male, would drop to under 50 kilos. In three years, you will have lost 60 kilos, bringing your weight down to 10 kilos. And, after that, you wouldn't even be here any more.

Quit drinking beer? You can't, it's self defence. Health experts say that a beer a day may be better for you than total abstinence. You are probably guaranteed good health in the coming years by your good drinking habit. So, bring on the slabs and keep drinking beer. And save the bananas and lettuce for the monkeys and rabbits.

**(A free beer to the first member to come up with the catches to these pieces of wisdom)**

*Alcohol makes you lean.- on bars, tables, counters & posts.*

## Traffic Lights –what is legal.

These days we see these young (and sometimes not so young) people run against pedestrian lights and we wonder what's happening to the world. Well I have observed this lately and I would like to describe some of the situations and the rationalisation one may use to justify them.

1. Lights are red but there's nothing coming either way. If I crossed a few metres up the road from the lights I wouldn't be breaking any laws.
2. I have crossed the main double highway with the green light but the left turn offshoot lights are red. There is no traffic coming down the left turn lane and it's only is three or four paces across.
3. In Melbourne CBD there are traffic lights at the intersections of Elizabeth St. and the “little” streets Flinders Lane, Little Collins etc. BUT there are no pedestrian lights and in fact it is difficult to see the lights oriented to the motor traffic. Question, is it illegal to cross when the traffic is on green in the little street? I can cross a few metres down the road in the same traffic.
4. On a double highway the light sequence includes right turn arrows. The traffic at my right where I am about to cross, is at a red light and traffic moving my way is turning right on the other lane beyond the pedestrian refuge in the middle of the highway. Am I being unsafe if I walk in front of the traffic at the red light and proceed to the pedestrian refuge.
5. Railway pedestrian crossings have gates that close when a train is approaching but have an “Emergency” gate that can be opened to give emergency access to the crossing. If the main gate has closed and the train is coming into the station platform on the other side of the tracks, and I need to catch that train to meet an important deadline, isn't that an emergency? There isn't another train for at least 4 minutes.

**Numbers 1,2 and 4** may not have danger if we are careful, but do we have the right to break laws because we think they are wrong? I have seen mothers (or Grandmothers) with young children in hand doing this and THAT is definitely wrong and what if they do hold back when everyone else is “running the lights, is this a good example to set?

**Number 3** is an enigma to me because most people walk across against traffic lights, and there are no pedestrian lights or lines which makes one wonder if this means it's legal to cross. BUT it **doesn't** make sense to have a sign “PEDESTRIANS CROSS WITH CARE ANY TIME” either

**Number 5** is stupid. I saw a man do this and the approaching train was an express and was travelling very fast. He just made it across. But this is a common practice.
