Over Easter I came across two articles in *The Age's* GOOD WEEKEND magazine that touched the same chord although they dealt with different subjects.

The first was by Stephanie Dowrick in an article titled "Beautiful Dreamers". Dowrick, writing from New Zealand, was extolling the beauty of the country, which, she said, lived up pretty well to the advertisements for it she had seen beforehand. Consequently, we attempt to configure our own dwelling space so that it reflects our individual concept of beauty.

Because I collect things, I end up displaying them for my own enjoyment (and perhaps the enjoyment of others), thus modifying my personal space to my liking. When I feel it should be modified yet again, I change the display.

Our Commonwealth Games Experience

Judy and Alan Baker

We both were interviewed and accepted as volunteers for the Commonwealth Games assessment team and worked every Tuesday at the World Trade Centre from October 2004 to December 2005. Our job was to help assess the 15,000 volunteers required for the Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games which were to be held during March 2006. While working at the World Trade Centre, we were asked by the Commonwealth Games Association (CGA) coordinator if we would be interested in working at the Commonwealth Games Village at Parkville as CGA Assistants. We accepted and attended a training course held at Holmsglen TAFE on the 18th January where we met the other three CGA Assistants allocated to the Canadian team. On the 19th February we collect our uniforms and received our M2006 Accreditation. Each volunteer was issued with 2 T-shirts, a hat, jacket, bum bag with odds and ends, a carry bag, and 2 pairs of pants, which were measured and taken up while we waited.

We started work at the Village on Monday 27th February, there was very little activity in the village as most teams and officials had not arrived. The Canadian team had a large support group of 49 Canadian Volunteers. The Melbourne 2006 Volunteers consisted of the 5 CGA Assistants and 5 Drivers. As the opening day came closer the village started to fill with people and the atmosphere was fantastic, during games time there were people everywhere.

The Canadian team had 323 athletes competing in the games and they were all accommodated at the village in a number of houses and portables. Each athlete received 41 articles of clothing, including uniforms for the flag raising at the village, uniforms for the opening and closing ceremonies, shoes, socks, even pyjamas and a wet pack with all their toiletry requirements. All of their clothing was packed into a large red Canadian travel bag. One of our first jobs was to make sure that every athlete and Canadian Volunteer had their own bag in the accommodation they had been allocated in the village. We moved over 400 bags, some of them more than once. This was a huge job.

During our time as volunteers we would leave home about 8am and drive to Brunswick, parking the car about a kilometer away from the village. All Melbourne 2006 volunteers had to enter the village through the workforce entrance. Our accreditation was checked every time we entered the village, a volunteer would sign us in at the time we arrived, and then we were given our lunch voucher. We would then pass through security, this was the same as at any airport our bums bags were x-rayed every day. We then made our way to the Canadian office to find out what jobs we were required to do for the day. The jobs we performed ranged from computer work, assisting the administration staff, checking the clothing in the containers (this was a nasty job as it was so hot in the containers), organizing the athletes and Canadian volunteers to have changes made to their clothing (again this was a mammoth task), each day the fridges were filled with bottled water, packing birthday cakes balloons and birthday cards for any athlete that was having a birthday during the games, and generally keeping a happy smile and a keen eye for things that needed to be done.

Alan worked with the Scottish Team for a while and we both were invited to attend the Scottish Team welcome function held at the Art centre. We wore our volunteer's uniform and Alan shook hands with Prince Edward. At the function we both had a straight scotch, as you would do when socializing with the Scottish team.

We also attended the team welcome function for the Canadian team at the Melbourne Museum. We met the Canadian Flag Bearer Chantal Petitoler, who won a gold medal in the 800 metre wheelchair EAD race, she was a delightful girl. We saw Chantal training around the village in

her racing wheelchair. In the village there were many athletes who were training, running, walking, bike riding and exercising.

We were invited to march in the opening ceremony with the Canadian team. They fitted us out with the Canadian Opening Ceremony uniform, part of the uniform was a small Canadian hand towel. The Canadian team was given instructions on when to take our caps off after passing The Queen and then we all waved our hand towels. We left in buses from the village and made our way to the Rod Laver Arena, waving too many well wishes who lined the streets. We spent time waiting at Rod Laver Arena this was fun seeing all the other teams in their uniforms. Each country was called to leave the Rod Laver Area to make their way to the MCG. What a thrill to march out onto the ramp with everyone cheering, it was fantastic. We waited for the Australian team to enter, the roar was deafening, and how proud we felt. Then the official opening and the fireworks, it is something we will never forget. This was a real bonus for us, and something we never would have anticipated. We took lots of photos in the middle of the MCG, they are real treasures, very red and white.

During our time at the village we saw many athletes, The Queen, Tony Blair and other dignitaries. The village was a very safe environment and everyone enjoyed the atmosphere, there were buskers wondering around entertaining, people walking and talking, you would often hear "G'day Mate" in all languages. There were two main dining rooms one for the athletes and officials, the other for the Melbourne 2006 Workforce Volunteers. The variety of food was amazing hot and cold meals, sandwiches, yogurt, fruit, chocolate bars, chips, deserts, tea, coffee and bottled water. There was also an outside BBQ area, all of this was free to the athletes and officials.

With our accreditation we had access to all of the sporting locations, on Monday 20th March we caught the bus from the village into the State Swimming Centre. Leisel Jones was on the bus and that night we saw her break the world record in the 100 metre Breaststroke 1.05.09. The same night we saw Ryan Pini win New Guinea's first swimming gold medal in the 100 metre Butterfly. We attended the MCG on Wednesday 22nd March when John Steffensen won the 400 metre race. We made friends with Kenny Doyle an EAD weightlifter from Canada and went to support him at the weightlifting. We sat at the very front of the stadium and cheered Kenny on wearing our Melbourne 2006 Volunteer uniforms, Canadian hats, and waving a Canadian flag, people were wondering who we were, it was fun, Kenny came 5th.

Melbourne 2006 Volunteers were given tickets to the closing ceremony at the MCG on Sunday 26th March, the Canadian M2006 Volunteers sat together and enjoyed the fantastic closing ceremony, the stand shook when the fireworks were going off. On Monday 27th March we went to the village then caught the bus to the city to march through Melbourne with all the other Melbourne 2006 Volunteers. What a thrill it was to march through the streets of Melbourne with such a large enthusiastic team, then it was back to work at the village. Packing up was well under way and it was a sad feeling knowing that the end was near. Tuesday 28th March was our last day as Melbourne 2006 Volunteers. With the final packing finished all the volunteers were invited to a farewell for the Canadian team officials at the South Melbourne Life Saving Club for pizza and beer. What a very Aussie way to finish our time as volunteers with the Canadian team. We had been out of circulation for 5 weeks, only having 5 days off. When we arrived home late on the Tuesday night we were both exhausted and pleased to finish our volunteering. Now it is all over and looking back we have had the experience of a lifetime and we know we have done our little bit in helping to make the Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games such a success.
