A short visit to the court library, a beautiful circular room, situated under the dome, with portraits of former judges and Chief Justices of the Supreme Court on the walls, completed our visit. - *Wendy*

Tour of the M.C.G. – Hugh Cornell

On Wednesday, 20th September, 28 members and friends enjoyed a tour of the M.C.G, one of the finest examples of the great sporting traditions of Australia. We were divided into two groups, our group being fortunate to have Leon Magree, resplendent in a blazer of the Club, as our guide.

We were soon walking on the hallowed turf, gazing around at the continuous tiers of seats in the grandstands and the gigantic light towers, six in all, requiring a dedicated power supply. It brought back great memories for those who had attended cricket, football, Olympic Games and other major events there in the past, even though it was in less comfort than present day patrons enjoy. The present seating caters for about 100,000 people and the stadium is among the world's most impressive.

The history of the Melbourne Cricket Club goes back to 1838 and one of the first touring teams to England was predominantly made up of indigenous people. The Melbourne Football Club was formed over two decades later and it was amusing to hear how a school match was played over three days in nearby parkland. The development of both games to their present elite status is thus a remarkable effort on the part of many hard-working officials and members over all of those years. One such important official

was Hans Ebeling, whose name is perpetuated in a major award for service. We were amused by the scoreboard of a cricket match between Victoria and New South Wales, showing Victoria's record score of 1107 runs for 9 wickets (declared) which was more than enough to win the match outright!

A visit to the "Long Room" caused a buzz of excitement with its many portraits and photographs from the past and top-class facilities. A tapestry (2m x 7m) of cricket and football heroes and celebrities of major events such as Dr. Billy Graham and the Three Tenors, captivated us all, and the statue of Donald Bradman was worthy of Australia's most honoured sportsperson. The tour also included being taken to the "Terrace", which afforded a wonderful view of the city and its skyline. Lunch at the "Pavilion" in the Fitzroy Gardens capped off a most enjoyable outing, for which we thank Elaine very much. *Hugh*
