Six members arrived at the Hayne’s place with six apologies from people going away for Easter.

John Read showed us some stunning cloud and sunset images he is considering making into one of his excellent albums. Look forward to this if it goes ahead.

We started the evenings proceedings by looking at the responses to the questions to the members put concerning use of fill flash. All present appeared to understand the contrast control this provides when working with sunlight.

We then addressed making interesting presentations, in particular using DVD on TV or video projection. It was explained that preparation of slides or digital images is required if you are to get the best results. The details of how this is done will be presented to those interested at a later meeting. Two short presentations of a Cradle Mountain walk in 2004. Were shown, one was the pure landscape shots with classical background music, and the other the “people having fun” shots from the same trip. This showed how it worked better if the images and music were selected and timed to complement one another.

There was then presented an audio visual (AV) produced some years ago using film slides and two synchronized projectors and audio. This presentation has been made into a DVD by scanning the slides and re doing the presentation using the NERO digital imaging software. This AV of a 1990’s trips to Cradle Mountain used two songs to put forward a message concerning preservation of our environment. We then saw a short presentation using Vietnam shots from the club tour last year along with some music to present a message concerning peace. Discussion developed about the pros and cons of having commentary along with presentations and it was agreed that this needs to be the theme of the presentation rather than an explanation of the images. Good images should stand alone to tell their story.

Wayne then took over and showed examples of how interesting transitions and titles can be used to make AV presentations more interesting and professional looking. Zoom effects in fact, made a still image presentation appear to be video. It was agreed though that overuse of these effects can take away the impact of the presentation and won’t make up for poor quality images. Wayne explained a lot about the software and how easy it can be to use it provided you have the basic computer skills.

During the evening the group decided plan for a project to make a presentation of their work to show at one of the club meetings at a later date. The group will make an excursion in the meanwhile perhaps to get some of the images for this presentation together. Watch this space as the ideas for this develop.

The evening was completed by a testing of some wine that Ron McBain had promoted and successfully sold to Elaine, taking his commission in several half glass tests.
