Going to Wimbledon – Elaine Hayne

One of the objectives we had when travelling to UK in June was to go to Wimbledon for the Tennis. You can only get seats in the main arenas by going into a ballot before the December prior to the event. We and our friends in London all put into the ballot but did not get seats. However, we decided to brave the “infamous” queues to get ground passes for the day on the second day which was the Tuesday. We got on the tube to Southfields station on the Wimbledon line and the tennis centre is about 15 minutes walk from there. At around 10am we easily found the large paddock (field) that the queues were being assembled in. You don’t just get in the queue, you get a ticket and go to an assembly area where batches of about 100 people at a time are entered into the queue. We entered the queue when our turn came after about 20 minutes. You can get food and there are toilets you can use, as your queue position is ticketed, there are no problems keeping your position if you “need to go”. We were reassured by the English gentlemen volunteer queue managers, that we would be inside before noon. And they were right. The 2 hours in the queue was a pleasant time with geniality among fans and we all got quite friendly. The fine weather that day helped with the enjoyment. After a thorough police security check we ambled up to the ticket office and paid our eighteen pounds (\$45.00) and we were in there. A great day, no crowding at all, and with patience I was able to get a seat and watch Sam Stosur win her heat. We also saw Wayne Arthurs’ winning heat against the Dutchman Thiemo De Bakker which went to a long 5 setter. We saw (on the big screen) Tim Hendon win his marathon (13 11) 5th set win over Carlos Moya on Centre Court. Strawberries and cream, plastic cups of Pimms and good beer for Doug (after his Strawberries & Pimms) made sure our experience of the wonderful atmosphere of Wimbledon would be a memorable one. Highly recommended in good weather and the queuing is no hassle whatsoever, in fact all part of the experience. *Elaine*
