Journey into the Australian Landscape

Thank you Garden Group, for the opportunity to visit the Royal Botanic Gardens Cranbourne. Just what this relatively new adjunct to Melbourne's Royal Botanic Gardens (RBG) had to offer was unknown to most of the 24 Templestowe Valley Probians who visited it on Monday, 6th August. And what an eye-opener it is!

The site, a large area of bushland with a disused sand quarry at its northern end, was selected by the trustees of the RBG as the ideal place to display the beauty and diversity of Australian plants. Fortunately, only the shallow sand-quarry area of about 20 hectares had been cleared of the trees, shrubs and grasses indigenous to this Victorian coastal environment. The remaining southern 50 hectares retained this vegetation: walking trails now wind through it.

An aptly named Australian Garden has now been developed on half of the former sand-quarry area. Its most spectacular features are crescent-shaped red-sand lunettes about seven metres high that rise from a red-sand plain sparsely populated by blue-green salt bush and the remnants of (simulated) salt pans. This red-sand garden is surrounded by a dry creek with radiating tributaries on one side and, on the other, a shallow, rocky stream hemmed in on one side by a towering sculptured wall of rusted steel 90 metres long. The wall simulates the side of any canyon you might find in places such as the Hammersley Gorges of Karijini National Park, WA or Kings Canyon, Watarrka National Park, NT. As in much of Australia, the stream runs intermittently (although in this case it is artificially controlled every 25 minutes). Surrounding this central core are young gardens of native plants set out to show what plants are suitable for the home garden, the water-saving garden, and 25 distinct and defined regions of Australia.

There is even a garden of the future. In the Arid Garden we saw "Black Boy" palms and cycads. Along the meandering Eucalypt Walk, we saw many types of eucalypts, and under-storey plants suitable for the rockery or the open garden.

Our guide left us after our tour of 90 minutes and we lunched in the Boonerwurrung Café in the environmentally friendly Visitor Centre before sampling the wares of the well-stocked gift shop.

Work is about to begin on developing the other half of the Australian Garden. If we visit again in three years time, we will discover a lake, hill-top viewing, additional home-garden displays, artworks and a picnic area – and maybe get time to see what is along those bush trails in the southern end of Royal Botanic Park Cranbourne. *Peter Fishley*

Profile – Margaret McGregor

I was born at Lidcombe a suburb of Sydney in 1941 to Alice and Len Bland, a sister for Judy who was 3 ½ years older. My dad was serving in the Army in New Guinea. I have very fond memories of playing with the boy next door, 2 days older and several other girls all the same age within a month of my birthday.

My dad was an electrical and mechanical engineer and started his own business in that suburb on his return from New Guinea. I vividly remember the sadness one day when my sister and I returned from school and finding out one of dad's apprentices had accidentally electrocuted himself whilst working during the lunch break on a job for himself. Subsequently dad was heartbroken and the business was sold, it was decided to do something entirely different so mum and dad bought the kiosk at Bulli Beach, 50 miles south of Sydney. We moved there on my 9th birthday.

I had always wanted a pony, it must have been after reading "My Friend Flicka" I think, and it was always said, no you can't have one, when we move to the country. So after moving and missing my close friends, my asking isn't this "the country", I got my pony. It was a very happy childhood. There were no supermarkets in those days, dad started delivering groceries and also those were the days of camping and caravanning, especially during school holidays, we were always booked out. The surf club was right alongside our shop and dad also used to organize outdoor concerts which would draw not only the campers but residents as well. I used to give pony rides, mum saying at the end of the day I would come in a very tired girl. Dad would set up a fruit stall outside during the busy Christmas period, which I would man and I used to swap comics as well, so always had heaps of friends helping me not just to read the comics but to ride my horse as well.

Mum and dad sold the business several years later and moved to a house that dad had built, opposite the beach, during the quieter months of winter; at the same time promising to take my mum back to her birthplace of England, (she had come out when she was 6 months old). Mum wouldn't go without her 2 girls, so my sister and I were so fortunate to spend 9 months traveling around England, Scotland and Europe in a Humber Snipe. On our return I did not want to go back to school so went to Business College for 12 months.

I started at Radio Station 2WL in Wollongong as stenographer for 1 year, ended up making up copy for advertisements and even went on air for 2WL Calling assisting an announcer Bruce Stokes. Then got a job at Dept of Labour and Industry as stenographer but also issued permits for young people to work in factories and used to assist the Apprenticeship Commissioner and did reports for Inspectors Factories & Shops, Industrial Arbitration and Building Work which was pretty extensive and very interesting as close to the Port Kembla area. Worked there for 7 1/2 years until we started a family.

I met my first husband Bill Leonard at a dance in Wollongong and married 2nd Feb 1963.

It was so sad as my sister's husband a Bill Clark was killed in a plane accident the day before our wedding, he was a journalist and covering the 175th Anniversary Car Trial around Australia and the pilot struck overhead wires and all 4 were killed. Of course, my sister could not be matron of honour. It was decided that the wedding should still go ahead.

Bill and I had 2 children, Grant and Alison. Bill was Production Manager of the newspaper South Coast Times but after a lead poisoning scare, doctors claiming from the printing, he changed direction and went into Insurance and climbed rapidly in the company and soon was promoted as manager for Bankers and Traders in Rabaul PNG in 1971.

Our 6 months in Rabaul was very eventful, we experienced 2 earthquakes, 2 tidal waves, a Matungun native uprising and the murder of Emanuel, the District Commissioner, pretty exciting but a little nerve wracking at the time. Bill was further promoted to Manager for Papua New Guinea and we moved to Lae, the company later became QBE.

I was asked to work for a Stock and Station Agency, New Guinea Pastoral Supplies Co, the only one in PNG and thoroughly enjoyed the job. There were only 2 of us and Doug concentrated on the outside and me the office and shop. We built it up to a much bigger business,

opening 3 branches and I had staff of 5 to assist me and another fellow was brought up from Queensland for Doug. I also started a Pet and Garden Shop next door which was the original office and this was a real hit in the city as everyone had "watch" dogs, we used to sell dog food by the cartons and people loved potting plants which we used to sell in the shop on commission. I had a cocker spaniel and one of my pups was bought by the Prime Minister Michael Somare, incidentally Michael Somare is Prime Minister again some 30 years later.

We also had a house in partnership with my bosses at Salamaua about 1 hour by sea from Lae and a lovely big Bertram boat and never once did we go out and not catch fish. It was a great social life with house help etc. and no TV.

We decided to return to Wollongong and came back in 1978 as I did not want my daughter to go to boarding school. My son had to go of course, the primary school was fantastic and very high standard but not the high school. Grant went to Newington and loved it. We bought at Mt. Keira but after about 6 months getting the old house sold and buying a new one, decided I was bored and returned to the workforce as Accountant/Secretary for the Wollongong Showground Trust. Guess what Alison ended up going to Abbotsleigh as a boarder, just wanted to experience the same adventures that her brother had and loved it as well.

Bill had itchy feet again and in 1983 sold my lovely home and bought a general store complex/service station at Woolli on the north coast with partners with the intention of starting an Insurance Brokerage. We were so busy (had up to 16 staff at Christmas), it also included a butcher shop which we ended up leasing out but nevertheless our partners didn't like the hard work and long hours even though it was their idea initially and returned to Canberra leaving us holding the baby.

Bill's health deteriorated, he was also a diabetic, so we decided to sell, Bill was offered a job in Melbourne, I was to follow as soon as settlement took place. It fell through and I ended up running the show on my own with the help of staff, for a further 6 months before leasing it out. I came to Melbourne in September 1986. A month later I started work as Accountant/Secretary for property owners, developers in St Kilda Road, Melbourne.

After several months of tests, Bill was finally diagnosed with a Brain Tumor; he lived for 1 day short of 12 months after his operation. Sadly my wonderful father died 3 months before Bill with lung cancer, we only knew he had cancer for about 2 weeks, it was so sudden, so it was a terrible year 1992. My mum is still alive at 95 and lives in Townsville.

I really loved my job, it was a challenge and I was well paid, suppose I should have returned to Sydney after my husband passed away, but obviously was meant to stay as after joining a group called Solace and meeting some lovely people in the same boat as me, they finally talked me into going to Hawthorn Town Hall dancing where I met a lovely sincere person and a good dancer called Ron McGregor. The rest is history, we married in April 1998.

My daughter married in 1993 and had 2 lovely little boys; tragically I lost Corey at the age of 2 years 7 months in Sept 98 after a bad fall at Cronulla. Ron accompanied me to St Ives in Cornwall for my son's marriage in 1996 and I eventually had a grandson and granddaughter to this union and they live at Coogee.
