VB – When first sold in UK, the label was identical except that wording was "Victoria Beer" as it is not a bitter in UK. VB Mid Strength and VB Original Ale

Melbourne Bitter.

Carlton Draft – Yes exactly the same brew in the bottle as from the tap, Carlton Sterling, Carlton Cold, Carlton Dry, Carlton Mid Strength, Carlton Black, (Stout)

Cascade - 9 products, **Reschs** - 4 products.

Pure Blond, Corona, Asahai, Stella Artois, Carlsburg, Bohemian Pitzner, Kronenbourg, Redback, Shanghai, Beez Neez, Crema, Hoegaarden, Leffe, Rooftop, Sheafs, Staropramen, Vailima. Fiji. Some brewed to brand recipe with imported ingredients under supervision from the brand owners others imported and distributed in Australia. Boags was distributed by CUB until Jan 2008.

Facts and drinking instructions:

Gebuine beer can only be brewed up to an alcohol content of around 6 percent alcohol/volume.
