What a shock for him a new little person with an abundance of red curly hair – not quite what he expected. – poor man.

My father lost his parents at a very early age and lived with an elderly neighbour – later known as Aunt Ruby who was pretty special as she had a piano and encouraged his love of music, which kept the family budget afloat in bad times, and provided much annoyance to us girls who would constantly tell him to keep quiet while practicing his beloved Tchaikovsky. We much preferred Elvis

Some of my early memories were of getting him ready to play at town hall dances every Friday and Saturday evenings His white tie and tails had to be perfect., but he did instill a love of music in all of us.

After leaving school to do secretarial work at a printing company in Richmond realised the auditor was very attentive. Ten days later we decided to make this team a life partnership.

In 1965 Michael & I married and moved to our new home in Doncaster opposite the “Boys” and so began a life long friendship.

Michael left accounting in 1976 , together we bought a small import/export electrical business and our true education began, learning to cope with fire, fraud, theft, wet and lost containers, ever changing government regulations, transient staff and where tax audits became commonplace – I lasted 17 years and Michael puddles in a much smaller version today

As a mature aged student I returned to finish secondary education then moved on to tertiary in design at RMIT and subsequently started a business in that area that closed its doors in 2004 after nearly 20 years.

In between time we welcomed our much loved Simone, Madeline and Stuart – now all married or committed with their own businesses and varied careers.

These days life is much slower – allowing valued time to devote to family and eight gorgeous grandchildren, trading the stock market and enjoy life with Probus friends.
