By Laws Amendment No 1

To increase our club membership.

Profile – Marjory Coronica

I was born Marjory Vera Ryan at Bacchus Marsh in 1935, the youngest of three children.

My father was a policeman then stationed at Bacchus March after stints at Warrnambool (where he met my mother) and Glen Huntly.

My father joined the Police Force by chance in 1924 when, after a row on the family farm with his spinster sister, a domineering woman, he headed for Morwell township to relieve his tension. He went to the Morwell Post Office and, finding a queue, joined it, only to discover that it was for enrolment in the Police Force, whereupon he decided to sign up. The mass recruitment of policemen was occasioned by the police strike of 1923, which had had such a devastating effect on Melbourne that the authorities were forced to recruit heavily in country areas. My father never returned to the farm – so here I am!

Three days before the outbreak of World War II, in 1939, we travelled by car – a necessary requirement for occupancy of a one-officer country police station – to Peshurst, just south of Hamilton, so that my father could take up his duties as resident policeman.

It was an interesting life. My mother became an unpaid policewoman, answering the telephone and taking messages at the office door while dad travelled around the large area he had to supervise. Everywhere there were sheep, as this was the bountiful Western District, famous for its fine-wool production. Around September, shearers would come on horseback for the shearing. On the farms, they would shear solidly through the week but would come into town on the weekend. The pub was just across the road from the Police Station: by lunchtime Saturday, quite a few shearers would be taking a "siesta" in the gaol – with the door left open.

In Peshurst, I saw the effects of drought, fire and flood, which have been and always will be typical of Australia.

My mother's people were early settlers (1842) in the Warrnambool district and I spent many happy times with relatives there. My aunty Rene's house was always "a house of welcome".

After the war, in 1946, we left Peshurst to reside at the Police Station in Kyneton, where I completed my education at the convent. The State school I attended at Peshurst gave me a very sound educational base, which I built on at the convent, but I found that I needed to adjust to the ways of the convent. My parents built a house in Kyneton and settled there on my father's retirement.

My working life was in accounting in many different backgrounds, and mostly in Melbourne, although I have had breaks away from pencil and paper. There was even a time when I did some nursing and, later on, I needed time off to have and raise my children.

In 1963, I worked in London and afterwards toured central Europe, Britain and Ireland. I arrived in London's Earl's Court on a Monday and by the Wednesday I was Assistant Bookkeeper at an Architect's office in, of all places, notorious Soho. I enjoyed myself very much throughout this holiday, but I knew before leaving Australia that I would eventually return home.

I married in 1969. My husband Albino (Alby for short), an Italian from Croatia and a skilled industrial toolmaker, and I, moved into our new Bulleen home the next year. We live there still. We have two children; Angela, who lives at Randwick, NSW and Peter, married to Kim. They live in Glen Iris with their two children, Ashton (nearly 5) and Madeline (3).
