Probus Getaway to Central Australia (Doug Hayne)

Responding to a suggestion from members, Ron McBain and Jake Kerseboom worked hard over the past few months to organise a motoring/caravan trip to Central Australia which ten Probus couples and two guests participated in using five 4wd vehicles. Bookings were made ahead at the Yulara Resort, Kings Canyon and Alice Springs for caravan sites and cabins. We had decided during the planning stage that car pooling for this type of getaway was not really a good option for various reasons so participants left Melbourne at their own time and pace and on their chosen route, to meet at ERLDUNDA on 13th June. Some came via the Oodnadatta Track, others via Mildura and others via Pinnaroo or Adelaide. We all met at ERLDUNDA and the fun started in earnest.

We were disappointed here to learn that Lyn and Ron couldn't make the trip as scheduled, due to Ron's ill health. but, they were able to commence their trip later, meeting with us at Coober Pedy as we returned home. Kerry and Pat McInerney had to abandon their trip due to a crisis at home. This left Jake and Jenny Kerseboom, John and Lyn Hudgston, Alan and June Chambers, Lorraine and Ray Cooper and ourselves with five vehicles and three caravans.

Colin and Marilyn, friends of Ron and Lyn, flew into Yulara and joined the group there. They were made welcome and soon joined in the fun.

We started with a happy hour on the day we all arrived and this lasted for three weeks. Those without caravans used on site cabins at the parks making social visits to and from the caravaners easy and frequent.

On our first day together we went to Uluru (Ayers Rock). The climb to the top was closed due to windy conditions but we were very satisfied with the 9Km walk around "the rock". We think this is a better option. The next day we walked through "The Valley of The Winds" at Kata Tjuta (The Olgas). This was shorter but somewhat more demanding but delightful. That evening was spent on the "Sounds of Silence" dinner experience where we were taken by bus to a lovely secret remote spot from where we could view "The Rock" at sunset and enjoy a buffet dinner and a guided tour of The Universe and also a very good didgeridoo demonstration performance afterwards. Well worth the \$150.00 per head.

After three nights at Yulara, on to Kings Canyon where we all walked into the canyon to view the 90 or so steps we may be negotiating the next day on the rim walk of the canyon. Three ladies and two gentlemen decided next day, to take a helicopter ride over the canyon instead of walking around it and then took the walk into Katherine Springs. The benefit of having a reasonable sized group was evident in that this decision did not affect the members who decided to walk the rim which they all agreed was well worthwhile. We spent two nights at Kings Canyon. The option to move on to Alice Springs via the Merenie Loop was voted against when we were told of a lady passenger having lost her earrings due to vibrations along the way. The loop is not suitable for caravans in any case so we stuck together and went the long but smooth way

On to "The Alice" where we planned various trips out from the town. Jake's experience in this type of 4WD travel was invaluable and he led the convoy of three vehicles as we decided to car pool for these trips. Our CB radios were indispensable - "turn left here", "do you want to go there?", "are we on the right track?", "where the bloody hell are you?" and all sorts of banter and jokes abounded over the air waves. We went on many rough gravel

roads which our 4wd vehicles handled with ease. First trip was via Maryvale station to the incredible Chambers Pillar which is not only a unique natural feature, but has great historical significance with the initials of famous explorers carved in it's face. On to Rainbow Valley famous for the brilliant colours under a setting sun which unfortunately didn't eventuate because of cloud cover. We did however get great shots of the brilliantly lit clouds in the sky on the way home.

Next day we did the the great Palm Valley adventure through the famous Hermannsburg mission town where Albert Namatjira was born. The road into Palm valley is definitely high clearance 4wd terrain (it's not a road but a rough river bed). An adventure for the drivers and a definite exciting experience for passengers. Palm Valley has unique Palms and Cycads and is a very lovely and interesting area to visit. A great journey and great destination.

Roads the various gorges around Alice Springs are mostly now bitumen roads and an easy day for each of the Eastern and Western McDonald Ranges. Around Alice Springs there were many things to see and do such as museums and exhibitions as well as a "Beanie Festival" which the Coopers will be only too pleased to tell you about. These excursions gave us rest days from travelling.

After three weeks we headed home. Some chose to stay a bit longer, others planning to move on into Queensland and others heading for the 4 day drive home.

This adventure was very successful due to the planning by Ron McBain and the leadership of Jake Kerseboom and the companionship of all.

It was agreed by all that by making our own way, then moving around the outback in convoy of three or four vehicles, and all staying in the same caravan park be it on site or in cabins, made this trip very memorable and enjoyable. Thanks to Ron, Jake and all who made the trip.

Amendment to the Standard Probus Club Constitution

As the accrediting body, Probus Centre - South Pacific Inc. wish to advise the formal adoption and enacting of the following amendments to the *Standard Probus Club Constitution* as at February, 2008.

Proposal 1 - Standard Probus Club Constitution

Article III (a) - Membership - remove the words 'who have held positions of responsibilities in' and add the word 'from'.

The article to now read:

'Membership of this club shall be open to retired and semi-retired professional and business people and others from any worthy vocation and who appreciate and value opportunities for social contact with others in similar circumstances.'

Proposal 2 - Standard Probus Club Constitution

Article IV (b) - Management - add the word 'consecutive'.

The article to now read:

'Officers and committee members shall be elected annually in accordance with the by-laws. The term of office of the president shall be one year, which may be extended to not more than two consecutive years if required due to special circumstances. The foundation president may serve two successive terms if the club has been formed less than nine months before the first Annual General Meeting.'

Proposal 3 - Standard Probus Club Constitution

Article V (c) - Meetings - addition of new clause

'Newly elected officers shall take office from April 1 each year.'
