On their return to Australia in 1942. their banner proudly flaunted a rat, along with the figure 8 on their Africa Star ribbon to show they fought with 'Monty's' Eighth Army in the desert. Their colour patch on hat and sleeve was henceforth to be changed by army decree to the shape of a T in remembrance of their stand at Tobruk.
