#### **What Peter Hollingworth said (Peter Fishley)**

On the eve of the retirement of Major-General Michael Jeffrey from the position of Governor-General after five years in office, it is worth reflection on what the Rt Rev Doctor Peter Hollingworth said when he addressed the Club in June this year concerning his time in the position.

Under the title, "Reflections of Office", Dr Hollingworth said the task of the Governor-General was to be the Queen's representative in Australia and as such, to carry out the tasks that fall to the head of state.

In essence, "it is a people job," he said, where the emphasis is the Crown's relationship with the people of Australia irrespective of which political party is in power following the outcome of the democratic electoral process. As such, it sits above the political process, free of party politics in a vital apolitical role, "a role not politicised," he said. This freedom lays on the shoulder of the Governor-General the responsibility for the nation "of upholding the best of our aspirations, beliefs and hopes," Dr Hollingworth said.

In answer to a question on his view of the possibility of Australia's becoming a republic and the impact of this on the role of the Governor-General, Dr Hollingworth replied, "The critical issue is what do you put in the place of a governor-general if we go down that path? The Crown signifies the common weal; the Queen or her representative is just the representation of that and, therefore, the position requires someone who understands this and can take on the role and perform it well."

Of equal importance, he said, would be the need to redraft and ratify the Constitution to reflect the altered situation adequately – a daunting job in itself and one likely to be fraught with much soul-searching and debate, given Australia's history of reluctance to upset the long established provisions of this guiding document.

"Our politicians must think more about the how these changes would be accomplished if Australia moves in this direction," he said.

Asked what he saw as the most significant challenge for religious people in so-called secular societies, Dr Hollingworth said, "First, we have to realise that there has been a deconstruction of all organised society and, second, to quote Australian historian Geoffrey Blainey, there is a virulent form of secularism that is anti-religious."

To the question, "How should we respond to those who follow Islam and those who subscribe to a militant, subversive and fundamental Islamism?" Dr Hollingworth replied, "We have to ask ourselves what has the person in question got that is good and, once satisfied, treat that person as our brother and of great human worth. Our Islamic brothers are leading the way back to a more spiritual view of the world – churches may grow through this."

Asked what would be Quentin Bryce's greatest strengths and concerns when she takes over as Australia's first female governor-general, Dr Hollingworth ventured the opinion that she would do a good job and that she would be a boon to rural people and to indigenous Australians.

He said one of his regrets was that an event that he drove in 2001 – a mass corroboree at Alice Springs, which brought together aboriginal people from across Australia – was overshadowed in the media by the events in the USA of 9-11.

### **Probian's Free Trip to Castlemaine (Ian Green)**

On Sunday 10th August, Twenty One of us braved the winter weather and travelled via rail to the historical town of Castlemaine. On arrival after a most comfortable trip, our first priority was a coffee break where we could discuss our plans for the day.

With the time we had, it wasn't possible to cover all the heritage and historical attractions of Castlemaine so we settled on a bracing walk to the historical home "Buda".

"Buda" (named after the Hungarian city of Budapest) was the home of Mr Ernest Leviny, a Hungarian migrant who was a gold and silver smith. The Levini family lived at "Buda" for two generations over a period of 120 years from 1861 to 1981.

Ernest and his wife Bertha had ten children, six daughters and four sons. Five of the daughters did not marry and spent most of their lives living at "Buda". All the girls had very creative and artistic talents – embroidery, smocking, wood carving, photography and metal - enamel work. Much of their work is displayed throughout the house along with many examples of their father's gold and silver smith work. After a fascinating tour of "Buda" and its gardens, we departed for lunch at the Criterion Hotel. A visit to the Arts and Crafts museum was planned but for some of us, had to be bypassed to enable us to catch the 4pm train back to Melbourne.

We shared a bed from Terry’s Day One...in a private single room. Marion had warmed up the bassinet a year earlier. Dalkeith Hospital Albert Park was the auspicious place of both arrivals but a year apart. Little did we know that our Karma had been set.

Port Melbourne was the background of Terry’s early years and perhaps of a misspent youth whereas Marion moved to Brunswick to live with her Grandmother, Aunt Dor and parents.

Terry’s childhood memories of “Port” were bookies down the back lane scuttling at the sight of the local cops, drunks spilling and slipping out of the pub as “6 o’clock” closing was called and painted, dressed up ladies hanging around street corners (Terry thought these ladies were going to church).

Marion lived with her dear aunt and grandmother and was spoilt by 4 adults and uncles who were constant visitors always bearing special treats, mischief and lots of love...it was idyllic.

Terry was a math wiz at Northcote High but continued on his chosen career path as a primary school teacher, gaining experience with people as he worked with The Referral Boys at the Brother hood of St Laurence.

Later he helped to instigate a training programme for the Probationary System and continues to work with Juvenile Justice.

Meanwhile Marion and her parent’s moved out of Nan’s house to a home of their own so her schooling was completed at Brunswick West State, Moreland High, University High and the last 5 years at Emily McPherson college studying Dietetics.

Karma decreed that they would meet again and they surely did at Preston East Tech (pre Northland) Terry was seconded from the Primary Division and Marion from The Royal Melbourne Hospital (sick of bird hour shifts). ...How lucky for Terry, along came this reasonable sort who could cook and owned a car.. all his fantasies were fulfilled (he didn’t know about the no-money till- too late). Marion saw this real spunk with crooked teeth, Hong Kong tailored clothes (money spent on tripping to the orient) and no-money.

After Karma did it’s work they were married without the usual blessings of the bride’s parents (some parents wanted the lot!! still not sure what that is) and produced 2 lovable, caring individuals, Jane and David. Jane has blessed us with an adorable grand daughter Jessica who is 13 and attends Mansfield High School.

Terry worked at a variety of schools in the Templestowe area concluding his rewarding career as Principal of Serpell Primary for 8 years.

Marion and a friend began a small successful catering company which lasted for 12years which enabled her to work as a Manager and Organizer of corporate events and weddings bigger

than BenHur. She is now a volunteer leader of water exercise with Arthritis Vic.

Both retired, Terry in ’97 and Marion midnight ’00.Travelling the world has been their passion for the last 44 years..and despite 3 hips, broken legs, kidney stones and generally wearing away they hope to continue their adventure together with the aid of our new Probus buddies and cherished old friends.
