The Day Australia Cried

We love to hate Victorians throughout the footy season
 Just for the fact they're from Victoria would seem a valid reason,

 when disaster struck Victoria, the day Australia cried.

 We heard the graphic stories of the panic felt that day
 As the townsfolk faced decisions, should they go or should they stay?
 The horrors of reality, their lives gone up in smoke
 The loss of whole communities with pretty sounding names.
 The toll we don't want to hear, the numbers who have died
 On that black Saturday, the day Australia cried.
 The worst peacetime disaster Australia's ever seen
 In surroundings long regarded as being so lush and green
 Drought throughout the country had left it tinder dry
 At the mercy of the fireballs that rained down from the sky
 The fires that raged through the hills that February day
 Have changed the course of countless lives in every kind of way
 There's absolutely nothing left of the futures that were planned
 Just twisted tin and ashes and scars upon the land.
 Survivors say they'll build again in their old neighbourhood
 And life will become normal, and life will become good
 But their lives will be so different and they won't forget the cost
 Of absent family and friends that they have loved and lost
 No matter where you come from, or how far you may roam
 There's some place in Australia your heart will know as home
 But above all we are Australians, State issues can't divide
 And we won't forget what happened the Day – Australia -
 Cried!

The Legendary Anzac

He had all the qualities of the legendary Australian, and a pride in the country few could exceed. He had flouted the rules and “never heard” of regulations. In camp, before he left Australia, in Egypt and at last on Gallipoli, he was the man to have beside you when the whips were cracking. In the back streets of Cairo when there was a scuffle, on hearing the call “Aussie Here!” he answered quickly and was as nippy with his knuckles as the next man.

“You will find out where I am when the Australians make a start”, he wrote to his mother when he left Egypt. She wrote back, not knowing he was already dead, “You said I would know when the Australians had made a start... well, the Australians have done gloriously, they have made England ring with their bravery”

On the night of April 25th he annexed a donkey and, on each day and into the night, he worked continuously bringing wounded down to the beach from the battle field. On May 19th he went up the valley where along the way he normally had his breakfast but on this day it wasn't ready so he continued on saying “Get me a good dinner when I come back”. He never came back. He was killed whilst bringing two wounded back on the donkey.

Yes, the man was John Simpson Kirkpatrick who for unknown reasons enlisted as, and called himself, John Simpson. He was an Englishman from County Durham and had travelled to Australia in 1909 as a merchant seaman and enlisted in the AIF at the start of the war.

The story of Simpson and his donkey is to a large extent, the story of all stretcher bearers. Unsustained by the hot blooded heroism brought out from men in violent action, unable to retaliate, with only the meagre protection of the red cross flag, these men calmly exposed their lives to danger to save their comrades and so built up the tradition of selflessness and cool courage that is a feature of their service.

There was no award given to Simpson, because “*One single act of valour*” was what a citation for an award called for.

An Anzac Story

Roy Kyle, an Anzac from Victoria began to write about his war experiences in 1986 when he was 89 years old. He returned to Gallipoli in 1990 at the age of 92.

A popular book called “An Anzac’s Story” from Roy’s memoirs edited by Bryce Courtenay, was published in 2003 after Roy’s death in 1996 in his 99th year. The book ended with the following paragraph.:

In 1990, Roy Kyle, when an old man, returned to Gallipoli with other survivors. While there, a Turk approached him and asked ‘Why did you invade our country?’ Roy paused for a few moments, perhaps not having an immediate answer. ‘We were part of the British Empire’, he suggested at last. The Turk smiled, then added, ‘We had an empire once’. Roy would later say that he saw the essential truth in it. ‘The sun does finally set on every empire. Everything comes to an end, nothing lasts forever. War never has nor ever will solve the problems of the human race.’

When War Came to Melbourne.

In Saturday’s Age, Page 9, was an article headed “Victoria’s Secret War.....our coast had become a battleground before Darwin’s bombing and Sydney Harbour’s midget sub attack” On 8/11/1940 the “City of Rayville” was sunk by a mine laid by the German Raider the “Passat”, which had mined Bass Strait. This became the first USA ship sunk in the 2nd. World War. Its wreck was just located recently off Cape Otway. In the following fortnight two more vessels were damaged as a result of this minefield, There was a total of 110 sea mines laid by this raider. An even greater event occurred on the 26th February 1942, of which I was a terrified witness, just prior to my 5th birthday. A Japanese I-25 surfaced near the northern end of King Island and assembled its aircraft on its launching pad and catapulted it on a 3 hour fact finding mission. The plane was a 2 seater Yokosuka E14Y reconnaissance float plane, with folding wings and tail, in an airtight container on the deck. A pneumatic catapult launched it and a deck crane retrieved it. Flying officer Nobuo Fujita flew north across Bass Strait to Cape Otway before dawn. He dropped out of cloud cover over Laverton Air Base and was sighted. He flew across Melbourne observing the Yarra, the City Centre, and six warships in Williamstown (and a gun battery that did not fire on him) before returning to the submarine near Cape Wickham Lighthouse on King Island. Some guns did fire and caused a lot of confusion and panic. My father, who served in the Naval Brigade in WW1 was in essential service, and had deferred digging our air raid shelter in the back yard. The authorities had supplied everyone in the Williamstown area with galvanised iron and timber, for this purpose, as we lived in a high risk area, with the Naval dockyards, the huge Newport railway workshops, the sewerage pumping station, the power house and the oil refineries. This was the spur that dad needed. It was dug that day! We all filed in for a trial and look-see, but the fates were cruel, and the heavens opened that night, and the clay was water proof.. At least 2 feet of water! It was bailed out only to refill. A lost cause. When peace came it was thankfully filled in. We couldn't even play in it. It was a Sunday, and it still stands out in my mind. *Kerry McInerney*
