**King Island November 2008.(Kerry McInerney)**

An early start for 22 members , leaving Moorabbin Airport at 7.50 am., on three Piper Chieftan Navajo , ten seater 'planes. We had great views of the bayside suburbs and The Heads, then 40 minutes later, we could see the Cape Wickham Lighthouse, on the Northern tip of King Island. It is the tallest one still operating in the Southern Hemisphere. From King Island airport, (a bit smaller than Singapore, ) we boarded our two cars and two mini vans, and drove off to the lovely Currie Bakery for a breakfast top up. Just around the corner was our motel , the Boomerang by the Sea. Each room had great views overlooking the golf course, complete with "resident wallaby" and the Southern ocean. The Tour Director had now been lost twice, so navigation was handed over to Jake (Redex Rally Driver) Kerseboom. First trip was to the seaside village at Naracoopa. Alas not a shop in sight, but the countryside was green and the walk along the beautiful Sea Elephant Beach was marvelous. We visited The Blow Hole but it only worked at high tide. On to Cowper Point and back to Currie for some free time. There were walks to the harbour, the museum and lighthouse. A fascinating place. The lady on duty lived in the lighthouse and the museum was the lighthouse keeper's home. Then there was the Art Gallery and the licenced grocer. Happy Hour at 5.00pm in the Tour Director's suite in room 17 which was formerly the restaurant. It was gigantic with separate ladies and gents toilets, an industrial kitchen, four beds, two sofas and a huge plasma TV. Dinner was in the new restaurant above the suite, with great ocean views. On Wednesday, a short drive to the beautiful British Admiral Beach. No litter, just clean white sand and sparkling water. Then a very interesting trip to the Kelp Factory. The lady gave a great talk. The factory only started in the 1970's and the Kelp, which contains the best alginate in the world, is processed into granules and exported to Scotland. It is used in cosmetics, toothpaste, ice cream, beer, shampoo and medicines. Next stop was to the King Island Dairy to sample the very tasty selection of cheeses, so that we could know what to buy just before we flew out on Thursday. They also showed an excellent video. Off again down south to the Calcified Forest, a remarkable lunar like landscape, tucked amongst the green bush. We passed a sign reading " Latitude 40 degrees South ". This indicated that to the west of King Island the next land was in Argentina, south of Buenos Aires!! We finally made it to Stokes Point, over some rough roads and through private property. It is the most southerly point of the island, and it was a wild windswept location. Bleak, deserted and great waves, reminiscent of Ireland and Scotland. A magic place. We continued on to Grassy, now the main port for the Tasmanian Ferry. It is now a sleepy hamlet with only a few shops, due mainly to the closure of the Scheelite mine. Crayfish had been ordered ( \$75.00 / kg) for pick up out of Currie on Thursday, so we returned for another Happy Hour in Room 17. As the motel cook had been rushed off to hospital, we all went to the Currie Pub for a counter tea. It was noisy (our own making) , but enjoyable.

Last day, up to the northern tip of the island to the Cape Wickham Lighthouse. On the way we called into Yellow Rock Beach. Another lovely spot, with the remains of one of the 643 shipwrecks that dot the coasts of Tasmania and King and Flinders Islands. There are no rabbits or foxes on the island, but turkeys, peacocks and pheasants have escaped and wander around in the fields. We saw a number of these on our drives. Wallabies are numerous and when driving you have to keep an eye out for these. We returned to The Dairy to collect our cheese, then into Currie to refuel ( over \$2.00 litre but worked out to \$13.00 a person for the whole three days), pick up the crays and head off to the airport. The Island is approximately 65 kms. long by 25 kms. wide, and we went from west to east and south to north. There were no traffic lights, and very little traffic. The people were so friendly and we had great weather. A great place to relax and unwind. The Tour Director was presented with a bottle of Holy Water which turned into Scotch on the way home !!! A special thanks to the drivers, Jake, Ray Cooper and Doug Hayne. All in all a great break.
