Vale Tony Shembrey

Anthony John Shembrey was born in Hamrun, Malta on the 27/12/1927. His father "was in the 'Royal Navy and was at sea most of the time. His mother, his sister and himself moved to Sliema where they had a small shop.

He remembers on a Saturday night Winston Churchill declared that Britain was at war with Germany and hearing noises overhead, looked up and saw the sky black "withl Italian aeroplanes bombing Malta.

He said for the next two years there was constant bombing up to twenty times a day and night.

He had an apprenticeship in the naval dockyard as a Marine Engine Fitter part-time in the ARP Brigade.

Food was scarce and people had to queue in a bread and soup kitchen, T'he Island was one week from starvation, He remembers watching from the bastions, relief food ships being bombed by German and Italian planes. Finally the American ship the 'Ohio', limped into the harbour held up by the chains of two British destroyers,

In 1941 the Island of Malta was awarded the George Cross for bravery by King George The Sixth, because "If Malta had fallen England would have been defeated."

After the War , the Australian Government sent ambassadors to recruit skilled tradesmen from Malta and as Tony said, "Bondi Beach and suntanned girls were enough to make one immigrate to Australia." On March 10th 1950 he arrived in Australia on the "Austurias" and docked at Station Pier. They were put straight on a bus and sent to Yallourn for two years. He came to Melbourne after about six months, as skilled tradesmen were also wanted here.

He found a job as a Marine Engineer, but when the company closed its marine department he went to work in the Way & Works Branch at the Victorian Railways and stayed there for twenty-six years. His job entailed going to the country to replace machinery(not trains) on the lines. At the same time he found some land at Sydendam and built three houses.

We were married in 1953 and built a house in Pascoe Vale. We stayed there for fourteen years but wanted better education facilities for our children, so we moved to Essendon.

Tony retired in 1985 and in 1990 we went on A Trafalgar tour to Europe including Malta. We went everywhere and saw unbelievable architecture including a church built in 1066. The isand is seventeen miles by five miles and he kept saying, "I've never been to this place before because it was too far from home. In 1997 we went again to London, Malta and Eastern Europe.

About this time his emphysema began to take a hold and he was failing in health. Last year we had a nasty car accident from which he never physically fully recovered. He had a sudden heart attack at home and died on 26th April this year. He was an inspirational man of great strength and courage.
