## Research Into Ageing

Deakin University is seeking 60-75 year old men as volunteers for a study investigating the effects of ageing on muscle recovery after strength exercise. A research team that is investigating the causes of age-related muscle loss in older men, a major contributor to falls and frailty in the Australian population are recruiting for a study which looks at how older muscles recover following a bout of strength exercise and how taking a protein supplement following exercise may hasten this recovery process and build bigger muscles.
