**Fort Queenscliff Tour**

Nineteen hardy probians braved the wet and very windy elements on Sunday afternoon to go on a tour of Fort Queenscliff which dates from 1860 when an open battery of guns was constructed to defend the entrance to Port Phillip Bay. The Fort underwent major redevelopment in the 1870s and became the headquarters for an extensive chain of forts around Port Phillip Heads which made it one of the most heavily defended harbours in the British Empire.

It was manned as a coastal defence installation continuously from 1883 to 1946. It is claimed that the first British Empire artillery shots of World War I were fired when a gun at Fort Nepean fired across the bow of the German freighter Pfalz as she was attempting to escape to sea. The orders to fire came from Fort Queenscliff. It is also claimed that this same gun also fired the first Australian artillery shot of World War II.

The Black Lighthouse at the Fort was constructed in 1882 and is one of only a handful in the world built of unpainted black stone. It is the only black lighthouse in the Southern Hemisphere. The Fort also features a muzzle loading cannon, dry moat, keep, signal station and an 8 inch disappearing gun. Our tour guide took us into the underground shell magazine which we all thought was very interesting.

By 1946 coastal artillery was outmoded and the Fort then became the home of Army's Staff College and in 2001 became the base for Army's Soldier Career Management Agency. It is one of Australia's largest and best preserved military fortresses and well worth a visit. At the end of the tour we visited the Fort Queenscliff Museum which has many historical documents and artifacts. *Jeff*

**Queenscliff Historic Tour (Laurine Eames)**

On Tuesday, the third day of our golf group getaway, ten members met Mary, our tour guide, at the Queenscliff Information Centre. Quite by chance we met Lou, a local resident who, as he mentioned, is the last of the local fishermen. This barefooted 84 year old man has never worn shoes and he was born on the beach. The walk was leisurely and showed a township of many beautiful and stately buildings. Queenscliff can boast of famous residents, past and present, including members of the Baillieu family. James Baillieu arrived in Australia in the 1800s and lived for a while in a tent on the Queenscliff foreshore. At the end of our tour we had a most delicious and generous morning tea at the magnificent Queenscliff Hotel. The tour is highly recommended.

Members have also been passing on their corks and other bottle tops to Lois for some time now. These are sold for recycling through Zoos Victoria and the funds go to appeals for saving endangered animals.

Total funds raised so far for the corks as of April 2009 is as follows:

- Corks = \$309,771.69 or 213.8 tonnes.
- Plastics \$1,938.60 or 6.4 tonnes
- Aluminium is \$703.40.

The overall total raised so far is \$312,413.69
