Our Egyptian Wedding (Andrea and George Thomas)

When Joanne and Amr announced their engagement back in January their original plan was to have two weddings – one in Alexandria for Amr’s family and one in Melbourne for us – back to back – and this year!! But that became too hard to organize and the Egyptian one became first. Mainly because Egypt was closer (geographically) as they both live and work in Qatar. Joanne and Amr went to Alexandria once to see the venue then Amr’s sisters were left to organize the rest!!!

I kept firing off what I thought were reasonable questions only to be told that they don’t do that in Egypt.

Joanne took a flying visit to Dubai in May to purchase her wedding dress and bought it in one weekend!!

Only to fall and break her ankle the very next day!! Still she had 8 weeks for it to mend!!

I, on the other hand was concerned as to what I should wear as I was informed that the female members of Amr’s family all wear the head-scarf, but no, I would be fine in “whatever”.??

As the August date was approaching I was becoming more apprehensive, and my questions were getting the “cold shoulder” Nevertheless on the Tuesday before we were to leave an SOS email from the bride to be arrived “What should I do about something old, something new, borrowed and blue??” I quickly rang my married daughter and was informed to get a blue garter and go over to Nana’s and borrow Great Grandma’s ring!!

We arrived in Cairo the Monday before the wedding to be picked up by the happy couple and ferried down to Alexandria. OH!! The traffic!! (But that’s another story) The 4 days before the wedding were a whirlwind of organized chaos, so much to organize which we in Australia do weeks and months beforehand, it was very difficult for Joanne as she doesn’t speak Arabic and I realize now that my questions that I wanted answered weeks ago she just didn’t have the answers herself – things like the cake and flowers were organized 3 days before the wedding and they were still waiting to speak to the DJ when we went to bed the night before.

But the day of the wedding arrived – she was married at El Salanlek Palace Hotel Montazah Palace Gardens on Friday 14th August – as their weekend is Friday /Saturday.

Joanne had been staying at the Sheraton with us and had to be out of her room by 11am – so before she set off to have the nails and hair done she transferred all her things to our tiny room. She left saying that she would be back to pick me up before going to the venue where she and Amr would be staying for the next two nights – by this time I had become used to Egyptian time i.e. give or take an hour or two!!

I secretly expected her somewhere between 2 and 3pm – I wasn’t far out – she was back by 2.30pm – but quick Mum, Nameen (Amr’s sister) is waiting. When I got into the car I was told that the hairdresser wouldn’t be able to do my hair and there probably will be a hairdresser on the premises!! I didn’t want to show my horror but my hair would be like a wet towel in the heat if I had to do it!!!

We did find the hairdresser at the venue, but they spoke no English so I had to take what they gave me!!! Cold shampoo, boiling hairdryer, and smoking attendants!!

Remember that Egyptian time span I alluded to?? The makeup lady was an hour late; the hairdresser was 15 minutes late and arrived while the makeup was still being done the flowers didn’t arrive until the photographer had arrived.

She looked wonderful. Now for the party!!

In Egypt as in some other countries the paperwork for a marriage is completed in the lawyer’s office a week beforehand so by the time of the party the couple is already legally married.

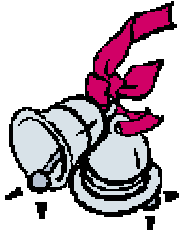
Joanne and Amr had photo’s taken in the gardens while there was still daylight then disappeared until all the guests had arrived then made their grand entry called the Zaffa which is a “parade” through the foyer amid guests clapping, musicians and much fanfare into the main dining area where they are seated in prime positions on the edge of the dance floor. Next came the presentation of the rings when they each place the ring on the others finger and proceed to toast each other (non-alcoholic) while no vows or pledges are made it was quite moving. Now for the dancing. There was lots of dancing and singing where everyone joined in. At 11PM the food arrived – 4 courses – during this time it was only the DJ who was supplying the music. Next the cake was bought out – by this time it must have been well after midnight and the party was in full swing!!! After the cake came the Belly dancer with her special live music, then there was another Live artist and more dancing. AT 2.30am Joanne and Amr started to say goodbye to their guests.

It was the most wonderful experience, we were made to feel very welcome, Amr’s family are wonderful, we certainly feel much happier having met them all and trust that Joanne and Amr will live very happy and fulfilled lives together.
