A Bus Adventure to The Power Works

We have been talking about using the council bus for a long time and at last we did something about it. A nice 20 seater bus was used to transport 18 Probians to the Loy Yang Power Station (Power Works) in Gippsland. James Campbell is a qualified bus driver and what a great job he did with a safe and timely journey to and from the Power Works. Uncle Arthur (Eames) provided us with an entertaining safety drill on the bus as we left, with James' usual "back seat driver" Marg handing over the job to Wayne. We arrived after a 2 ½ hour journey and then an entertaining and knowledgeable guide took us around the huge complex including the well documented cooling towers that put all of that steam out that we see on TV when they talk about carbon emissions. Our guide was able to inform us that the power station could be replaced with 14000 wind generators when the wind is blowing. We went down into the open cut coal face which is available for the next 200 years if we need it, then into the power generating room complete with ear plugs and helmets to observe the noisy nothingness of the workings of the generators.

We then enjoyed a lovely lunch at the visitor centre before taking our homeward journey to arrive back to our cars at exactly 4pm. A great day. Thanks Elaine and Helen for organising the tour and the bus and to our crew James and Wayne
