### CULTURE WALKS with Kenneth Park

The walk for June has been cancelled due to lack of support.

#### **Footscray Cultural Walk—A Study in Flux. Thursday 27 May**

For most of the 12 people on the Footscray Cultural Walk, this suburb was unknown territory. But for Noel Hatton it was a journey back 55 years. Noel remembers the red four-wheel trams on the Droops Street Tramline that heads for the Footscray Market and the railway station. He remembers when the Grand picture theatre in Leeds Street was in full swing and he used to frequent it on a Saturday afternoon. And he remembers the long-gone second-hand tool shop in the three-storey building at the southern end of Nicholson Street opposite what was Footscray Tech and which is now the Nicholson Campus of Victoria University.

But everything is now changed, he says. We could see that in the way the Classical, Victorian, Art Nouveau and Art Deco facades of shop fronts have undergone modification as businesses have come and gone. We could see from the English street names that the first residents had been Anglo Saxon. But many of the shops now sport Italian, Asian and African business names. And, from the people in the street, we could see that many were from those parts of the world, especially Africa.

Kenneth Park took us on a ramble from the centre of the commercial centre in a southerly direction to Napier Street. He pointed out that two rail lines from Melbourne fan out through Footscray, one going south and the other north and that the Maribynong River hugs the municipality on its north, east and south sides. We noted the proximity of the container terminal to the south east on the junction of the Maribynong and Yarra rivers and that the rail tracks through Footscray carry an extra rail to allow for standard gauge freight trains.

The most impressive building we saw was the Town Hall and Municipal Offices. The building, in red semi-glazed bricks, stretches out along Napier Street, from which it is set back in a landscaped garden and framed by large trees. Its colonnaded portico and elaborate balcony above the main doors is ornamented with Egyptian-inspired motifs in the Art Nouveau style - a grand and imposing building.

At Footscray railway station, we were intrigued to see a modern pedestrian rail bridge clashing with the Federation architecture of the station it serves.

Our walk circled back to the Mall, where a coffee/kebab shopkeeper was happy to ply us with tea and coffee to refresh us.

It was sad to see that Forges of Footscray nearby, an apparel trader and Footscray institution for several decades, appeared to be in terminal decline, if not defunct. The abattoirs, woollen mills, motor garages and many manufacturing businesses disappeared many years ago from this predominantly working-class suburb, the original

home of the Western Bulldogs. But the commercial hub is showing all the signs of r4efreshing itself by utilising the well constructed buildings erected 100 years ago as the locale for their new and vibrant commercial enterprises. Footscray has an allure, once you have found it, as we did.
